We have also been thinking of Easter and have been preparing for our Easter service just as we end our term for our Easter break. The service was very good and the 6th form did a fantastic representation of Jesus rescuing someone from the temptations of the world. It touched everyone watching. We are thankful for a break as there has been a lot of illness recently, a lot of colds, coughs and flu. Gwen has bronchitis at the moment and has had three days off school. There has also been another outbreak of dengue and Eva, the head of

primary, was in hospital with it last week. She was already off school having broken her ankle a few weeks ago.

One of our secretaries had heart surgery two weeks ago and then got pneumonia and they had to operate again as she was still bleeding internally. Her life seems to be hanging in the balance at the moment but there is a lot of prayer for her and others who are ill.

One of the families in school have a one year old baby and recently took him to the USA for the removal of a tumour in his brain. Other parents came asking for a prayer meeting each morning and Pastor Ronnie takes that. On the day of the baby's operation there were over 30 parents there praying.
