Here is a slightly delayed Christmas special update for you all! Thank you for waiting! We hope you enjoy catching up with all that has been going on with us here in Lima in a very busy but exciting couple of months. We'd also like to let you know that we will be back in the UK for a few months from mid-March until mid August 2010 and so we will hope to be catching up with many of you soon. Sarah's news: It has been really great to have 'El Arca' play scheme up and running in San Pablo! Every Friday Lily, her daughter Lynn and I meet with around fifty children on the dusty hillside and spend an hour playing, listening to a bible story, singing, praying and having a snack. Lily is very committed to the project and does a sterling job registering the children and reading them stories. It was very special for the launch of the project to have the support and encouragement of Rev. Adam Foot and wife Kate from our link church, St. John the Evangelist, Welling. Adam looked like a 'World's Strongest Man' competitor as he lugged the huge bags of toys to the mission!

I know the project is having a positive impact on the children and it has been so great to start getting to know the children and their stories. It is a privilege to be able to listen to them and pray with them.

It has been good to see at 'El Arca' in Ventanilla how some mums are helping out more. They cleaned the mission before the Christmas party, prepared the hot chocolate and helped decorate. The children are such a delight. Recently two of the older girls, Xiomara and Flor asked me to pray with them because they wanted to follow Jesus. The Christmas party (chaos though it was!) was a high point of all of us at the mission pulling together as a team. We pray that the children were blessed by it and will remember the message of the nativity play.

Paul's News: It was a privilege to have the opportunity to travel to the south of Peru and be part of the follow up to the youth mission in Juliaca. Working with Lizbeth, the diocesan youth coordinator, and the church in Juliaca, we prepared a day's activities for the young people there. It was great to have over thirty attend and see that the group that started after our mission trip there is still meeting and growing. I was also able to be part of youth leader training and leading youth groups in Arequipa as part of the same trip. It is encouraging to see many green shoots of youth ministry across the diocese. We had times of teaching, ministry, games, worship and fun on the nearby beach and it has seemed to encourage youth leaders in a number of congregations where youth ministry is a very new concept! Youth ministry is really beginning to be taken seriously in Peru and a few of us from the youth ministry team were able to attend the "Youth Specialties" national youth leaders conference which was an encouragement and inspiration for all of us. I hope and pray some of the connections made there will bear fruit for the future.

What would you do? - Going deeper No. 15

Getting to grips with cross-cultural mission and some of the issues we encounter. Take some time to chew over the issues! Here's this month's:

A Going Deeper Christmas special for you this issue! There is a tradition in Peru for many of the well off, companies and all those who work in poorer communities to organise a Christmas party for children who don't have a lot. This normally consists of entertainment or games, hot chocolate and paneton for everyone and a present for all the children. It is very moving to see people like our neighbours involved in organising and providing for these parties.

However, this tradition of parties can lead people to expect gifts and to see gifts as a right. We have seen how people (normally the parents more than the children) can be transformed by their desire for presents, to argue, complain, steal from others or ask to swap a present if it is not quite what was wanted! It can lead to jealousy between communities and between members of the same community. Should we, the Church, put on these parties? If we do, how can we avoid the jealousies, greed, thefts and other associated problems?
