I hope you're well. It's hard to believe that it is nearly Easter. Autumn has arrived here but the temperatures are still mid to high 30's most days in Concepcion. We are hoping it will cool down soon.

As many of you know the church, the pastor's house, my house and accommodation for visitors are all on the same site. Short term it will be myself and Estela's sister - Melva living here, but longer term we need a family on site. We are praying for that too as there is a lot involved with living on site - hospitality, upkeep, people coming for prayer, or while passing through Concepcion from the annexes etc. Thank you for your prayers.

Please pray too for Norma and Saul who are responsible for the Indian shelter. They do a great job. The Indians can spend a few days there while passing through from the Chaco - to buy and sell things, for hospital appointments and so on. For things like sickness they can stay longer. They have recently had a lot of people there for longer periods of time. One pregnant lady was there for several months while her husband was in Asunción with their other child who was sick.



Everything has settled back here after the Summer holidays. We had some youth camps in the holidays (January) which went well and encouraged the young people. Many of them have lots of challenges at home and at school so they need a lot of support. A lot of them are starting to come to the Chaco and Horqueta to help out when we go there on Sundays to work with children, youth and adults. It's great to see them using their gifts of music, sports, teaching etc. some of the youth were so touched and challenged by the living conditions of the Indians in the Chaco that they headed out themselves to collect clothes to take there.
