

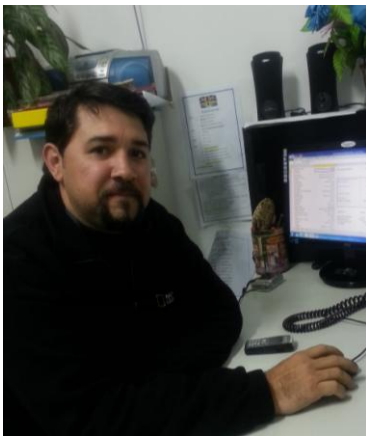
# Anglican Paraguay Prayer Calendar

## March & April 2014

### Week Sat 8 – Fri 14 March: Important in the sight of God

*(David Gives Thanks to the LORD) David went into the tent he had set up for the sacred chest. He sat there and prayed: LORD God, my family and I don't deserve what you have already done for us, and yet you have promised to do even more for my descendants. You are treating me as if I am a very important person. 1 Chronicles 17:16, 17*  
How wonderful that the Lord treats his people as very important, counting each one of us as of great worth.

We pray for nurse Beryl Baker's truck was stolen as it was parked on the road outside her house full of provisions that she about to take the Chaco, we pray for wisdom, peace and God's direction for Beryl.

FEISA: as the training college starts the new academic year we pray:

- for Adriana who is the first former FEISA to be employed on staff. ### **Week Sat 12 – Fri 18: Holy Week Practical Living**

*And since I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash each other's feet. I have given you an example to follow. Do as I have done to you. This last year has been very challenging, their oldest son died tragically and there are many social problems in the community such as drunkenness and lack of opportunities for young people. Please pray that Juan will be made strong spiritually by the Lord and that the Holy Spirit will help him to make the most of the many opportunities that there are for pastoral work in his community. Pray that Juan will be encouraged this year and that significant leaders will emerge in the community who desire to work alongside Juan in a positive manner.

Mirador Source of Life Church:

- pray that the Lord will lead regarding the church's desire to open a children's feeding programme
- give thanks for the commitment of two young men Sadrak and Gustavo who are sharing Bible readings with members of the Mirador community
- give thanks for a committed group of praying women
- pray for the Saturday youth meetings with 11 young people attending

Pastor Ronnie wants us to pray:

- that he will be an instrument in the hands of the Lord to promote spiritual growth
- that Christ the Saviour Church will become known for its welcoming and loving atmosphere and that people would come to find it as their spiritual home
- that it would be possible to set up a meeting in St Andrews School specifically for fathers

Dealing with sects: St Matthews Rio Verde has the challenge of a Jehovah's witness family who have moved into the community, the teacher at school in Yatnata is also a Jehovah's witness. The Chaco Anglican communities receive sporadic visits from sects and also extreme Pentecostal groups who all believe that they are the only way to God and should rebaptise into their churches those who are already followers of Jesus. This often has an unsettling influence on the local believers. Let us pray for church leaders Juan, Romualdo, Lucio, Mario C, Robert, Agripino, Niño Pepe, Mario R, Andres, Victor, Agustin, Luis and Chris that they would provide Biblical teaching which enables the congregations to know how to deal with these visits and the false teachings that they promote.

Several new groups have started recently and an initiative to encourage memorization of scripture is going well. Those who memorise scripture are given their own copy of the scriptures. Please pray for the new church council in Yatnata, which is in fact two councils, one for general church work and the other for ladies. The ladies council is very active, with the ladies running weekly prayer meetings and ladies meetings.

We pray for Bishop Peter teaching in the Cathedral on the work and ministry of the Holy Spirit in the life of a disciple.

We pray for families in the Chaco where fathers work away from home that this Easter would be a time to renew faith and strengthen family life as men return to the communities for the holiday weekend. We pray that many would make meeting together as God's family a priority.

We thank the Lord for teachers and pray that they will be filled with joy this Easter weekend. May they be blessed during this break from classes, we pray for all Christian teachers in Paraguay that you will enable to keep their eyes fixed on the Risen Lord and their ears open to the gentle voice of the Holy Spirit as they move in the vocation that they have been called to. We pray for Elvio as he moves back to Yatnata and will be working out of an office in Yatnata. He faces many challenges in his work and also more general community issues. Pray that the Lord will work in and through his life.

We pray for Pastor Donald Brooks, the leadership team and the church in Luque that they would know the Lord's guiding and enabling in their discipleship of young people and children.

St Paul's church praises the Lord for the people He is bringing back to Him and to the church, some of them after many years and pray that each of us will continue to grow in Him, develop in our Christian life and know the power of the resurrected Christ.
