It is difficult to be able to describe in such little words all the things I am experiencing in Ireland. It is the first time that I have left South America and I couldn't have had a better opportunity to serve God.

I worked all of 2007 in different jobs

in Argentina, in the morning and evening from Monday to Friday and at the weekends I sold empanandas (typical Argentine food) to save money to be able to buy my flight ticket. God has really blessed me from the moment I knew that I had the opportunity to come to this country and God has opened many doors so that I can come. I arrived here on the 26th January with Cecilia Valdiviezo, the youth leader in my church; with the aim of helping in a local church as a SAMS volunteer. over a period of 6 months, serving in various ways. I did not know what

God had prepared; experiencing a different culture, language, food and climate, but I knew that He was going to be beside me and that I would never leave His hand.

At the minute I have already been here for 4 months and I can now say so much more in English than in my first week! I have been working in a church in Annaghmore (between Dungannon and Portadown) where I have made new friends and truthfully a new Irish family. I am living with Dorothy McVeigh who is the Minster of the local Anglican Church. She is such a lovely person who treats me like a sister and I admire her for her work and dedication. I am working in the church doing various activities. I am helping in the Sunday School, during the week I am teaching Spanish to the group that is going to come to visit my country as part of the SAMS Ireland 'Beyond the Norm' programme in 2009. I am also helping in many other activities in the church. Nothing is more pleasing than serving God.

In the little time that I have been here I am able to say that I have grown in my relationship with God.

Each day I give thanks to God for

the opportunity He has given me to be able to live like I currently am and for strengthening my spiritual and personal life because this is an unforgettable experience. I lost my father when I was 7 years old, he died from a heart attack and suddenly he was no longer with us. It was very difficult throughout childhood to accept and understand why all the other kids had a complete family and I was living only with my mother and sisters. When my father was alive we had all we needed but when he died we were practically homeless with no money so my mother had to work and my sisters and I helped.

In everything God never left us, we have a house and we are all healthy. God showed me that in everything he has a purpose. He made me understand that even when my father and mother have left me, He is my refuge in everything. He is my father who spoils me and amazes me every day, and it is for this reason that there is no better way of showing thanks than working for His glory. Being here as part of the SAMS fusion programme is very important. I am so happy to be to be experiencing life in Ireland developing relationships and being blessed by numerous people who look after me! Thank you so much for being my family here and I trust God will bless your life as he has done for me. God loves you and has a plan for your life. You only need to put your hope in Him and listen to his voice.
