Learning perseverance

The word of God encourages christians to welcome hard times because, in God's hands, they will never be useless. The book of Romans 5:3-4 reminds us that suffering: **"produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope"**

One of the features of a church planting project is its invisibility. At times, it seems that nothing is happening, but still there is tiredness, frustration and confusion. Then you remind the reasons that brought you there, prayer becomes central again and the word of God gives

you new strenght. It must be said that there is particular joy when God, in his grace, allows you to see some of the fruit He is bearing. This cycle comes and goes, it doesn't stop, but somehow God keeps giving you what you need for the ministry He has given you.

That is our testimony as a family at the end of 2013. God has been faithful and He has told us: "I am Here...but what about you? Are *you* here?" And in prayer, we have said to Him "Yes Lord, we want to see a flourishing church in downtown Santiago, a place of

restoration, healing and salvation. We want to be a family that loves those who don't have one. We want to see a church solidly grounded in your word learning to love your Son over any other thing, plan or person". And so, in His power, we are finishing the third year of church planting with an average attendance of 60 people, there is a prospect of a student ministry ahead and a new small community to start in the southern part of the city. So we ask you to keep praying for us that God may give us strenght, endurance and vision.
