

Praise the Lord that our first Conference of the year in Río Verde, earlier this month, was very encouraging. It was not, however, without obstacles. At the last minute Agustín had to find a replacement cook, then due a misunderstanding, an extra cook appeared uninvited. Threats of road closure due to a demonstration meant we had to collect some of the participants a day early, but the lack of fire wood needed for cooking threatened to sour relationships. Overloaded electricity supply meant we held our first meeting illuminated by just torches, mobile phones and the occasional flash of an under-powered flourescent tube. Misunderstood radio messages threatend to cut the number participants and heavy rain meant that Bishop Andrés had to cancel his plans to participate!

One of the outcomes of our time together was the proposal that Makxawáya be the location of our next conference for the benefit of some ten to fifteen church leaders who live in the area and don't normally get a chance to participate. The Gumersindo, ordination candidate suggested date is 16 to 19 of April with another meeting in Río Verde in May or June to evaluate the experience and plan for the future.

Praise the Lord that the mechanics seem to have solved one of the problems that plagued our truck for over a year. They still warn us, however, that we should really be thinking of selling it sooner rather than later!
