### Week Sun 1 – Sat 7 May Give thanks to God!

## **Week Sun 8 – Sat 14 May Praying for Paraguay**

This week we pray for the nation of Paraguay celebrating 200 years of independence from Spain. *Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, and the people whom He hath chosen for His own inheritance.* Psalm 33:12

Please pray for Paraguay:

- for President Lugo and the government for wisdom and good governance
- for the church as it prays and responds to proposed legislation which would effect social changes which many Christians believe to be against biblical teaching on the nature of the family
- for all those who are ill due to the continuing dengue fever epidemic, and as health resources are stretched to the limits with hospitals and clinics temporarily closing down non essential wards to make room for more beds for patients with dengue, for patients and their carers whether they be doctors and nurses or family members
- for effective measures to be taken to halt the spread of dengue through prevention of reproduction of the dengue carrying mosquito and for those affected by allergies and reactions to the strong insecticides used to spray streets, gardens and houses against the mosquitoes
- for increased health care provision in the Chaco also remembering nurse Beryl Baker and her health clinic in Rio Verde
- for Mission Paraguay and David Orritt as the orientation event for the August group takes place on 14<sup>th</sup> May in Lancashire, thanking God for the people he has called and that once again they have the right range of gifts and experience. Also thanking God for the generosity of people and churches supporting this work despite difficult economic times in the UK
- thanking God for the beauty of Paraguay, its flora and fauna and natural resources, praying that they will be carefully used and cared for
- for all foreign aid and mission workers who have chosen to make Paraguay their home asking for safety, good health and a God given ability to work for the long term blessing of Paraguay, remembering also their families in other parts of the world and praying especially for Caroline Gilmour White's family as they plan for her father Tim's care after a spell in hospital in Exeter

## **Week Sun 15 – Sat 21 May Praying for the Chaco**

We thank God for Paraguay today 15<sup>th</sup> May on it's Independence Day (Paraguay declared independence from Spain on the 15<sup>th</sup> May, 1812) asking God to abundantly bless Paraguay in the next stage of this nation's history. Please pray for:

- Tim Curtis has rejoined the translation team and has restarted checking on completed Old Testament drafts, hoping to finish the checking of 2 Kings and Amos in the next few weeks. Thanking God that Ed Brice was able to supervise the translation team in Rio Verde during Tim's absence
- the family of an 8 year old boy who died after being bitten by a rattlesnake that the resurrection of the Lord may bring in hope at this time of tragedy, also praying for protection of young children in the Chaco from snakebites
- translator Martin and his wife Mariana, for spiritual protection during this period of mourning for the sad loss of their prematurely born twins, that they too may know the hope of the resurrection of Jesus
- protection for the Enxet translation team, Tim, Asunción, Juan & Martin and caretaker Nelson and their families in Rio Verde

## **Week Sun 29 May – Sat 4 June Waiting**

## Week Sun 12 – Say 18 June Pentecost

This Pentecost week as we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, let us pray that we will eagerly follow the Holy Spirit as we seek to serve the Lord in our everyday living, in our families, responsibilities and churches. Let us pray that the Spirit will teach us how to love sincerely and how to honour others, counting them as more than we count ourselves.

You might like to take some quiet moments this week to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in any relationships where you are aware of hurt, a lack of peace or lack of forgiveness.

This week we pray specifically for the churches and communities in the Chaco:

- **Rivers of Living Water**, Holy Spirit we pray that the members and leaders of this community *might live in the Spirit and walk in the Spirit* (Galatians 5:25)
- **Spring of Eternal Life**, praying for pastor Elvio and Lorenza, that the Spirit of Eternal Life would cause life to flourish *as the believers sow in the Spirit and reap life everlasting* (Gal 6:8)
- **St Matthews**, praying for pastor Ed and his wife Marie, for the Spirit's enabling as they teach the way of Jesus: *Instead of offering sacrifices to me, I want you to be merciful to others. I didn't come to invite good people to be my followers. I came to invite sinners.* Matthew 9:13
- **Rock of Peace**, pastor Lucio and his wife Priscila, *praying that God, who gives hope, will bless this community with happiness and peace because of their faith. And may the power of the Holy Spirit fill them with hope.* (Romans 15:1)
- **San Fernandez**, pastor Robert and his wife Cristina, *praying that the church will become stronger, as the Holy Spirit encourages it and helps it to grow.* (Acts 9:31)
- **Encounter with God**, pastor Mario and his wife Rosa, praying that the Holy Spirit will breathe new life into many lives: *only God's Spirit can change a person into a child of God* (John 3:6)
- **St Peters**, pastor Juan and his wife Alicia, deacon Romualdo and his wife Yrna, praying that many would *turn back to God and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, receiving forgiveness of sins will be forgiven and be given the Holy Spirit* (Acts 2:38)

### **Week Sun 26 – Thurs 30 June Making mistakes**

It has been said that the most valuable currency in 2011 is not money. Nor is it intelligence or attractiveness. It is relationship. A 2002 Nobel Prize for Economic Sciences was awarded to a psychology professor at Princeton University whose studies prove beyond any doubt that we behave emotionally first, rationally second. If we translate that to our jobs, churches, organisation, families and friends, we realise that each one of us can accumulate or lose emotional capital. It is easy to make mistakes!

This week let's take time to pray for ourselves and our churches that we might be enabled to learn to be more godly. Jesus can teach us to forgive one another, to speak the truth lovingly, to count others needs as more important than our own, to be patient and compassionate. He will teach us about important things like justice, mercy and faithfulness. Amazingly we would not learn to grow in such godly aspects if our communities were not made of people who struggle and make mistakes.

This week you might like to take time and pray the Lord's prayer:

- reflecting on the quality of your relationships
- seeking God's forgiveness
- forgiving where there has been hurt and pain
- praying for someone you know is struggling or who has made mistakes they regret

*God has done it all! He sent Christ to make peace between himself and us,  
and he has given us the work of making peace between himself and others.  
What we mean is that God was in Christ, offering peace and forgiveness to the people of this world.  
And he has given us the work of sharing his message about peace. 2 Corin 5:19*
