Week Tues 1 – Mon 7 Nov Rejoice!

Pray that the Bishops of the Province of the Southern Cone would be given wisdom and that each delegate would listen with a humble heart to others with distinct points of view. Pray for our sister Dioceses in the varied challenges that they face, and give thanks for their witness to the risen Lord Jesus and his saving power.

Caroline Gilmour White: we grateful for the prayers for the **St Andrews Chapel Centenary** (Sep 2012) which have resulted in a flood of resources, ideas and help for the centenary project. It is causing quite a buzz in the neighbourhood. The next needed prayer is that we would meet the December deadline for handing over artwork to the cinematographer.
