

## Paraguay Prayer Calendar March & April 2010

### Week Mon 1 – Sun 7 Mar Thanking God for unsung heroes

*My dear friends, we always have good reason to thank God for you, because your faith in God and your love for each other keep growing all the time. 2 Thessalonians 1:3*

As Paraguay remembers National Heroes Day, let's take time this week to pray those who have been unsung heroes in communities around the world, remembering those:

- who bring relief when disasters strike, especially those who are working tirelessly in favour of the earthquake victims in Chile and Haiti
- those whose generosity in giving the gift of their time, energy, talents, wisdom or resources is enabling Gods mission to transform lives in Paraguay
- who choose to be part of God's team and the good things that He has planned for Paraguay
- whose acts of kindness have touched our lives this week

**Pastor Luis Echeverria** asks us to give thanks for new folk who are responding to God's call to serve.

**Caroline Gilmour White** encourages us to give thanks for the generous provision of resources for sewing workshops and for gifts to help stock the Diocesan Library.

**St Andrews School** give thanks that the new school year has started well with the children glad to be back in classes. The opening service in the Cathedral was enjoyed by pupils, parents and staff.

Along with **Charlie, David & Raquel** we thank God for all the good things that happened at the Provincial youth camp and the positive impact on the **Anglican youth of the Province of the Southern Cone**. Thank you Father God for all who worked so hard and contributed to make this a special time for the participants.

We give thanks for **church leaders and pastors in Paraguay** as they meet together on the 4th – 6<sup>th</sup> March, thanking God for their ministries and praying that they will be equipped for the task of mission.

Lord Jesus, it's amazing how you bring together, in unity of purpose, unsung heroes of different ages, from distinct cultures and backgrounds to take part in the life and mission of our communities so that your love is able to transform people in different places. ### Week Mon 8 – Sun 14 Mar Facing Change – Honesty and Humility

*Giving an honest answer is a sign of true friendship.* Proverbs 24:26

Søren Kierkegaard noted '*Life can only be understood backwards, but it must be lived forwards*'. We pray for ourselves and all who are facing and implementing changes, remembering that the process needs to start with honesty.

**St Andrews School:** we pray for

- fruitful meetings with parents leading to good relationships and a clear understanding of expectations
- new pupils both in preschool and further up the school
- new staff members
- the implementation of new technologies such as Smart boards
- 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade camps to be fruitful times, enlarging pupil perspectives and outlooks, offering opportunities for community service
- Nelson Aguilera's input into staff training

Robert McCheyne, a 19<sup>th</sup> century pastor, encouraged his congregation to complete the phrase... 'The greatest need of my church is...' Lord God we pray that our churches will be filled with humble servants like McCheyne, whose personal answer was 'The greatest need of my church is my personal holiness.'

**The Redeemer Church** in Zeballos Cue, ask us to pray as some church leaders have moved out of the area due to housing needs. Pray that the church may adapt to these changes, and members be flexible and willing to face challenges with honesty and humility.

We pray for **Rev Ronald & Nicky Irene**, Natasha, Tamara & Daniel, as they adjust to their new life in Asuncion and ministry opportunities.

We pray for **Rev Cefe & Ana Romero** and their family as Cefe retires after 25 years of ministry in Roque Alonso. We thank God for this family's ministry and for the new opportunities that lie ahead in retirement.

We pray for those who have been part of the church here in Paraguay and are now adapting to a new life and different cultures. We remember **Patrick & Rosie Butler** and family in Guilford, **Claire Holmes** now living in Lurgan and on deputation in Northern Ireland, and **Wendy Power** now nursing in Cambodia as a CMS SALT partner with VSO, and **Elaine Black** back in the UK, asking that each one would be given honesty, humility and strength to face the challenges of adaptation. Amen.

We pray for **Teo Rivas** and assistant **Donald Brooks** working together in the Diocesan Administration, for wisdom in the setting of priorities.

We pray for **Sharon McCririe, Hector & Delia** seeking God's direction for La Puerta project, in the wake of PUAFE's sudden withdrawal from the project, praying that they all will remain close to the Lord. During this process of unexpected change Sharon hopes that 'We will increase what we were doing in the shanty town and maybe use the facilities in the meantime for retreats for the addicts there who are not making it remaining in the environment. Only God knows what surprises he has prepared for us to show his care and love.'

### **Week Mon15 – Sun 21 Mar Lent – time for reflection (from Stop & Stare, Nick Fawcett)**

- praying for Pastor **Lucio Romero & Esteban Galeano** (Chris Hawksbee's co worker) as they negotiate with the community leaders to set aside land to dedicate to **cattle production**, probably in family units, to generate an alternative income to the fragile agricultural model
- praying for the clergy, **Lucio & Mario** as they attend to the spiritual needs of the church.

- giving thanks for **faithful groups of Christians**
- praying for clergy **Robert, Niño Pepe, Agripino & Mario** that they may be faithful pastors and teachers of Christ's flock and promoters of unity.

- praising God for the initiative of deacon **Romualdo** and a small group who want to move forward and resume **beekeeping** and so increase the income base of the community
- praying for **good community relationships** as they need signed approval in order to present the proposal request to the Government ministry

- giving thanks for the new school building in Yatnata and the **community interest in their roots**

*Out of respect for Christ, be courteously reverent to one another.* Ephesians 5: 21

Lord, thank you for the diversity of your church in Paraguay. Help the church to treasure those who are distinct. May we be open to meeting and sharing with all in our communities of faith. We pray that during this time of Lent we may become more open. May we also be kind members of the People of God. Amen.

*Wives understand and support your husbands in ways that show your support for Christ. The husband provides leadership to his wife the way Christ does to his church, not by domineering but by cherishing. So just as the church submits to Christ as he exercises such leadership, wives should likewise submit to their husbands.* Ephesians 5: 22 – 24

Christ, you are the head of the church. Thank you that you exercise authority with gentleness. Teach your Church in Paraguay to learn from you, so that authority is exercised in a way that is respectful and kind. We ask these things so that your Church will be built and made stronger. Amen.

*Husbands, go all out in love for your wives, exactly as Christ did for the church – a love marked by giving, not getting. Christ's love makes the church whole. Christ's words evoke her beauty. Everything he says and does is designed to bring the best out of her, dressing her in dazzling white silk, radiant with holiness. And that is how husbands ought to love their wives. They're really doing themselves a favour- since they're already 'one' in marriage. Ephesians 5: 25 – 28*

Christ, thank you that your love is making the Church whole. We pray that your disciples in Paraguay will continue to learn to love fellow pilgrims. Help us to bring out the best in others. Amen.

*No one abuses his own body, does he? No, he feeds and pampers it. That's how Christ treats us, the church, since we are part of his body. And this is why a man leaves father and mother and cherishes his wife. No longer two, they become 'one flesh. This is a huge mystery, and I don't pretend to understand it all. What is clearest to me is the way that Christ treats the church. And it provides a good picture of how each husband is to treat his wife, loving himself in loving her, and how each wife is to honour her husband.' Eph 5: 29 – 33*  
Christ, you delight to give good things and to your Church. Today, please show me a practical way in which I can make someone else in the church feel special. Teach me more about honouring fellow pilgrims. Amen.

*'Children do what your parents tell you. This is only right. 'Honour your father and your mother' is the first commandment that has a promise attached to it, namely, 'so that you will live well and have a long life'. Fathers, don't exasperate your children by coming down hard on them. Take them by the hand and lead them in the way of the Master.'* Ephesians 6: 1 – 3

Father, thank you for your patience with us, your children. Thank you that you don't come down hard on us, you delight in encouraging us. Help church members in Paraguay to encourage others. Grant insight into the situations of others. Today please help us to choose to use words that build other up. Amen.

*'Servants, respectfully obey your earthly master but always with an eye to obeying the real master, Christ. Don't just do what you have to do to get by, but work heartily as Christ's servants doing what God wants you to do. And work with a smile on your face, always keeping in mind that no matter who happens to be giving the orders, you're really serving God. Good work will get you good pay for the Master, regardless of whether you are slave or free. Masters it's the same with you. No abuse, please, and no threats. You and your servants are both under the same Master in heaven. He makes no distinction between you and them.'* Eph 6: 5 – 9  
Master, sometimes it sounds strange to call you Master, but yet that is what you are, and I am the servant. Often I don't act like a servant. Today help me to do all the tasks that need to be done with a smile on my face and a humble attitude. Fill your church with women and men who will delight in being true servants. Amen

### **Week Mon 26 – Fri 30 April Greeting others with kindness**

Rabbinic tradition places importance on how we greet one another. Rabbi Yishmael encouraged his disciples to *'Receive every human being with gladness'*.

Studying the Gospels we discover many occasions when Jesus initiates conversations which bring dignity to others: *Jesus saw the woman and said, 'Don't worry! You are now well because of your faith'*. Matt 9:22

As St Paul finishes his letter to the Roman Christians he reminds them of the importance of welcoming newcomers, asking them to: *Welcome Phoebe in a way that is proper for someone who has faith in the Lord and is one of God's own people. Help her in any way you can. After all, she has proved to be a respected leader for many others, including me.* Romans 16:2

In your prayers this week please pray that our churches will become more welcoming communities. As you go about your daily life take time to be aware of the people who are present in your life those who and cross your paths this week and take the opportunity to greet them in a way which reflects Jesus' love for them, remembering St Paul's words: *I pray that our Lord Jesus will be kind to you.* Romans 16:20
