## Prayer Letter

Happy New Year!! Sorry this has been so long in coming, out of school means out of routine! I had a fantastic summer break travelling and exploring various parts of South America; although it now feels like a distant memory! It was busy, but relaxing and I now feel ready to start into a new school year.

As I write, teachers have been back in school for a week and the students start tomorrow (15<sup>th</sup>). I'm teaching more or less the same as last year – 2 small groups in secondary and one in primary, as well as helping out with various classes as and when needed. I'm enthusiastic about starting off from the beginning of the school year (I arrived towards the end of last school year) and have all sorts of plans and ideas of what I'd like to do with my classes.

I spent last Saturday with some friends on a Habitat for Humanity project in a small village about 90 minutes from Asunción. This opportunity came as a real answer to prayer. We were digging holes for septic tanks and washing walls with acid to remove excess concrete. It was a hot, tiring day but I really enjoyed it and hope to be involved in more projects in the future.

So, some points for prayer as we start the new school year:

- For the leadership of the school, in their planning and organising, and in communication with staff.
- For the school's staffing needs to be met, especially in the English departments.
- For my church, St. Andrew's – we're in need of a full time pastor, pray for financial resources; and for good leadership, unity among members & opportunities to reach out into the local community.
