I actually ended up in hospital on a drip that night - thankfully we'd already had our honeymoon!

The youth group has returned this month and it's been great to get the group back together. We've worked out a good programme with a good balance of study, evangelism and relaxation! We're pleased that one of our members, Claudimir (Gordo, which means 'fatty' in English!) has been accepted to go to Argentina in the new year on a mission trip. He's currently studying at the seminary and it's a fantastic opportunity for Gordo, who was brought up on the shanty town and converted and disciplined within the



church. We're proud of him, praying for him and helping him to raise the cash he needs to go.

Rose and I met up with our dentist friend who has agreed to keep on giving free dental care to the boys-Gabriel was the first back in last week. This is a great help for the project since all of the boys never went to a dentist whilst living with their families and have some serious dental issues... Dental treatment is extremely expensive in Brazil so it's great that we have a dentist for the project.

In my executive role I've been visiting a few local companies and businesses to see if they would like to help the project in some way. Hopefully the local bread shop will begin to provide the project with daily free bread which will be a great help to reduce the monthly food bill! Plus a restaurant chain is interested in helping us with food donations. It's been very

encouraging but let's keep praying that the help may materialise! The boys are doing well. The daily devotionals have returned and the boys are enjoying them. One of the boy's Unde was shot and killed last week which was a little upsetting for him. At the end of the month and English couple, Michal and Francesca Boden are arriving to spend around a month helping out in the project.

We've also been having a number of meetings to start up a program specifically aimed at gang members who are keen to leave the lifestyle behind. We've had a number of get togethers with a group of around 5 boys (ages 15 - 21) and hope to start a mentoring system. We took them to spend a day at the farm and hope to start a football group with the help of an ex professional who used to be addicted to crack during his playing days. Working with these kind of kids is hard, sometimes they don't show up due to the drugs etc and their lives are in danger daily from other gangs.
