
Link Letter No.4 October 2011

Since touching down in Brazil I have been reminded of the old adage that the aim of a mission partner should be to do oneself out of a job. Training students who will be tomorrow's clergy is one way in which I see myself honouring the brief – this term I'm lecturing on Anglicanism (not as boring as it might sound to some!) and next year I'll be doing a series in Recife on preaching.

On Wednesday nights at the Cathedral, I'm taking folks through 'James,' and about 30 are coming along which is not bad for a midweek meeting. Next month will see the launch of my second book in Portuguese which deals with a range of issues on Brazilian Christianity. In connection with the book, I've also been invited to give some guest lectures in a Lutheran Theological College in Curitiba (down South) next February, so next year's diary is beginning to see some action.

- (1) If you think you have problems with traffic jams, the average Paulistano (resident of Sao Paulo) spends one month in a year, stuck in traffic!
- (2) Brazil (again) has topped the world charts for homicides over 43,000 murders so far this year (our city, however, is one of the less violent ones, and we feel safe and blessed here).
- (3) With phenomenal economic growth in our region, the northeast, Great Britain is now actively seeking to improve trade and commerce links with Brazil.
